

MEET MS. HARPER LEE

Nelle Harper Lee Born April 28, 1926





WHERE SHE GREW UP...

- Born April 28, 1926
- Harper Lee grew up in a small town of Monroeville, Alabama





- Her father was a descendant of General Robert E. Lee
- Father was a lawyer and a state legislator
- Many say father was role model for Atticus Finch (father in the novel)

FRIENDS WITH THE FAMOUS AUTHOR...

Truman Capote



SCHOOLING...

Lee attended the University of Alabama

Here she wrote articles and editorials for her college

She continued on there to pursue her law degree, but dropped out in 1949 to move to New York to become a writer

WRITING ATTEMPTS...

During her time in New York, Lee wrote many short stories, none of which were published

Finally, an agent saw the short story To Kill A Mockingbird

FINALLY PUBLISHED...

- Lee turned the short story into a full-length novel, finishing the first draft in 1957
- She spent 2 years revising it, and it was published in 1960.
- One of the most influential books beside The Bible

A Background of

TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD

- First published in 1960
- TKAM follows the story of Scout Finch (a girl) thinking back on her childhood with her brother Jem, and a childhood friend named Dill

 The reader is transported back to the 1930s to Maycomb where Scout grew up



CONTENT...

- Scout encounters characters from all levels of society
- She learns about the injustices of racism & witnesses the divisions between class and race
- Scout comes to respect the diversity all around her

LEE'S SKILLS...

Lee tells a story where children lose their innocence as they grow up and encounter the harsh realities of life

Her story speaks to the acceptance of all kinds of people

COMPARISONS...

- Maycomb County = Monroeville, Alabama
- Scout Finch's age= Lee's age
- Atticus Finch's job= Lee's father's job
 - (a lawyer and state legislator)
- Many more connections seen throughout the novel

A THOUGHT TO PONDER...

The story is set in a time and place where racism is still running rampant.

How might racism play into the loss of innocence for Scout and Dill?
